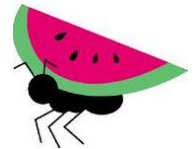

(Chinese Exclusion Laws)

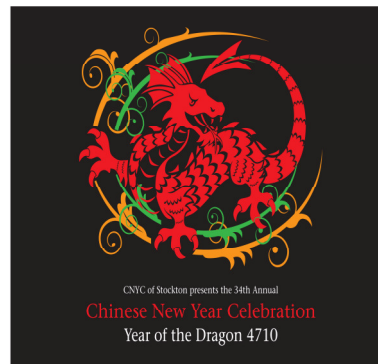
The 1882 Project is a nonpartisan, grassroots effort focused on educating lawmakers and the public about the Chinese Exclusion Laws and the impact such legislation had on our history. The Project aims to work with Congress to pass resolutions expressing regret for the passage of the Chinese Exclusion Laws and to increase national awareness of the laws. Several national civil rights organizations spearhead the 1882 Project: the Chinese American Citizens Alliance, the Committee of 100, the National Council of Chinese Americans and the Organization of Chinese Americans.

The Project wants Congress to formally acknowledge and express regret at the passage of the Chinese Exclusion Laws. Through resolutions, Congress can reaffirm its commitment to protect the civil rights of all people in the US. The Project hopes to get the House and Senate to each pass a resolution because only a sitting Congress has the power to acknowledge history and to make amends. Congress needs to act now, before the last living generation subject to the Chinese Exclusion Laws leave us.
